Notification to Teach Physical Therapy Without an Ohio License

ORC 4755.482 states that an Ohio license is required to teach a physical therapy theory and procedures course in physical therapy education. This law also authorizes an individual who meets certain requirements to teach for up to one year without holding an Ohio license.

This form must be completed to teach a physical therapy theory and procedures course as the faculty of record without an Ohio license. Rule 4755-23-13 of the Administrative Code outlines the notification process, which must be done prior to the individual teaching in Ohio without an Ohio license.

- Individual holds a current, valid license to practice physical therapy in another U.S. state or territory (**Note: Notification in this category can be reviewed/approved by Board staff; Notification form must be submitted by the individual seeking authorization to teach**)

(**Note: Notifications in this category require a member of the Physical Therapy Section to review and approve; Notification form can be submitted by the individual seeking authorization to teach or by the educational institution**)
